

## English 3P Honors: One Pager Assessment

A one-pager is a written and graphic interpretation of what you have just read presented on a single sheet of paper. The **purpose** of a one-pager is to own what you are reading. A one-pager connects the verbal and the visual; it connects the ideas in what you read to your thoughts. The one-pager becomes an artifact that demonstrates your understanding and connection to the reading you have done.

### Guidelines:

- Use standard (8 1/2 x 11) unlined paper (computer/printer paper)
- Fill the entire page
- Written work must be in ink or typed
- Use markers/colored pencils for illustrations
- Include all of the following – arrange on the page any way you choose
  - Title of work and author
  - Three or more quotes from the reading (quotes that you find important and that tie into the **essential questions**---What defines the idea of America? What are the qualities/characteristics of “American Identity” as revealed through the work of literature you have selected?)
  - A personal response to each passage you selected (an interpretation/explanation of its significance – answer “Why did I choose this excerpt?” and “Why is it significant to the literature?”)
  - At least 1 graphic or symbol which relates to each of the passages selected (hand/computer illustration, magazine pictures, or clip art style)
