Objectives: 1.) Connect & Respond to Stimulus Materials 2.) Practice starting introductions with quotes.

TOPIC: Select a quote from stimulus materials you selected to that connects to the TOPIC of interest.

INTRODUCE EVIDENCE: Explain the quote. What connection does it make to your research interest? What does the quote explain about the importance of your topic and the problems you will investigate?

EVIDENCE: What examples from the world around you reveal the importance of your TOPIC and the reasons for your interest?

ANALYZE: What problems are revealed through your REAL WORLD examples?

COMMENTARY: Why do they matter to our moment? Why do they deserve your/ your reader's attention? What questions do you intend your research to answer?
